## Cluster Grant Program

This program provides matched funding of \$150,000 to four eligible Cluster Applicants across our nation's food and agribusiness sector. The funding is to help businesses, government and researchers unite to tackle challenges in regions and/or cities. By working together for the common good, stakeholders in the cluster can take advantage of market opportunities either domestically or overseas.

### Carbon + Biodiversity Pilot

The Pilot is trialling arrangements to reward farmers for improving on-farm biodiversity together with carbon projects under the Emissions Reduction Fund (ERF). Under the pilot, farmers who plant native trees – in line with a biodiversity protocol developed by the ANU – will receive payments for biodiversity outcomes. Eligible activities will build on ERF carbon projects. Eligible regions are: Burnett-Mary in QLD; Central West in NSW; North Central in Vic; NRM North in Tasmania; Eyre Peninsula in SA; South West in WA.
