TIF provides \$50 million assistance for new local productions which have been unable to start production due to production insurance exclusions relating to COVID-19. The aim of TIF is to support local film and television producers to start filming again in circumstances where new productions have been halted by insurers not providing coverage for COVID-19.

Production companies will need to pay a fee for TIF coverage. For productions which commence principal photography on or prior to 30 June 2021, the fee is calculated at 1% of the TIF coverage provided for a production.

Export Marketing Development Grant

The recently-changed scheme encourages small- and medium-sized Australian businesses to develop export markets. Small to medium enterprise (SME) exporters can apply for 3 different grants over 8 years (not necessarily consecutively) for eligible promotional activities. Grants are available in 3 stages, called tiers.

Each tier provides a different level of support to SMEs as they grow their export markets:

- Tier 1: Ready to export - for First time exporters; Maximum 2 years and maximum \$40,000 per financial year
- Tier 2: Expanding - Expanding your export promotion activities; Maximum 3 years and maximum \$80,000 per financial year
- Tier 3: Expanding and strategic shift - Expanding your export promotion activities AND making a strategic shift, for example targeting a new market or a new type of customer; Maximum 3 years and maximum \$150,000 per financial year
- Representative body - Maximum 3 years; Maximum \$150,000 per financial year

Regional Event Fund: Incubator and Flagship Event Streams

The Regional Event Fund identifies and supports events in regional NSW that have the potential to act as a 'cornerstone' or flagship tourism event for their area by attracting overnight visitation and delivering long term benefits to the region. There are 2 streams:

Incubator Event Stream: offers seed funding to eligible events in regional NSW to support their first and second years of activity. Grants of up to \$20,000 (excl. GST) are available to support activities that are likely to establish an event as a driver of visitation.

Flagship Event Stream: supports the marketing of emerging events in regional NSW that have been running for more than two years to increase their profile and encourage visitation. Annual grants of \$20,000 or triennial grants of \$30,000 per year for 3 years are available to eligible events to support marketing activities that encourage overnight visitation from outside the region in which the event is occurring.

PBC Capacity Building grant funding
